As an amendment, Councillor Ferguson, seconded by Councillor Sturgeon, moved that the grounds of the appeal had been substantiated and accordingly that the appeal should be upheld and the appellant reinstated. On a division there voted for the amendment 3 and for the motion 3. On the casting vote of the Chair, the motion was declared carried.

Accordingly, the Committee agreed that the grounds of the appeal had not been substantiated and accordingly that the appeal should not be upheld.
