1. Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest by Members in terms of Standing Order 16.

2. Strathclyde Police

Sergeant Porter provided information on the following:-

- Police statistics for the period 1 December to present date, including 1 attempted murder, 11 serious assaults, 5 robberies, 1 assault with intent to rob and 33 reported cases involving drugs:
- the publication of the community policing action plans in the near future;
- Operation Impact, which will target drug misuse, violent offending and give a focus on domestic abuse incidents by enforcing outstanding warrants;
- the test purchasing initiative targeting licences premises which resulted in 2 failed first tests within the Area Committee boundaries;
- the action, in conjunction with other agencies, to tackle disorder and related issues in the Hayocks area of Stevenston;

- roadside initiatives undertaken, in conjunction with Trading Standards and HM Customs and Excise:
- the 'Old Firm' initiative, targeting port-match violence and disorder; and
- the publication of the results of the recent public consultation exercise.

Members asked questions, and received further information, on the reporting methods following the results of test purchasing cases and regarding onward referral to the Licensing Board.

3. Strathclyde Fire and Rescue

Submitted report by Strathclyde Fire and Rescue on activity from 1 December 2009 to 10 February 2010, which included information on community initiatives, property fires, secondary fires, flooding incidents and other special services.

The Community Safety Co-ordinator highlighted the following:-

- the use of the mobile community safety vehicle, which will be stationed in the Co-op car park on Arran on 24 February 2010, and, thereafter, in the Ardrossan and Kilwinning areas;
- the continuation of home safety fire visits;
- a pilot project undertaken, in conjunction with NHS Health Scotland's initiative to tackle passive smoking, to offer home fire safety visits to smokers; and
- the invitation to Members to attend one of the March dates for the forthcoming "Reckless Driving Wrecks Lives" road safety events to be held in Ayr.

Members asked questions, and received further information, on an issue highlighted by a recent BBC news report on faulty fire engines.

4. Community Benefit Fund: Applications for Grant Aid

Submitted report by the Chief Executive on an application for grant received in respect of the Community Benefit Fund.

Members discussed various matters in relation to the criteria and disbursement of the Fund, in particular giving consideration to the application from Caledonia Piping Club.

Councillor Munn, seconded by Councillor Munro, moved that the Area Committee agree to refuse the application from Caledonia Piping Club.

As an amendment, Councillor Gibson, seconded by Councillor McNicol, proposed that the Area Committee grant £2,000 to the Club.

There voted for the amendment 6 and for the motion 2 and the amendment was declared carried.

Accordingly, the Committee agreed (a) to make an award £2,000 to Caledonia Piping Club; and (b) that the Project Officer, Economic Development, (i) circulate a short questionnaire to members, and to Airtricity, seeking to clarify views regarding the criteria for disbursement of the fund and (ii) report back with the findings to the next meeting of the Area Committee on 1 April 2010.
