1. Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982

The Chair welcomed the representatives from the taxi trade to the Licensing Committee and explained that the meeting would provide an opportunity for the Committee to gather information on a range of licensing issues and for discussion to take place on a number of associated areas. A report outlining any proposals arising from the discussions will be submitted to the next meeting of the Licensing Committee for consideration.

Thereafter, discussion took place on the following areas:-

- Licence fees;
- Duration of licences;
- Signage and advertising on vehicles;
- Substitute vehicles;
- Taxi Fare Review;
- Vehicle inspections and facilities at Byrehill Garage; and
- Age capping of vehicles.

The Committee agreed that a report be submitted to the next meeting on:-

- The availability of a one-year licence with an appropriate pro-rata fee;
- The requirement for varying tests for taxi vehicles;
- At what stage new vehicles require a MOT and/or roadworthiness certificate;
- The application of a substitute vehicle fee at the expiry and renewal of the licence;
- The application of one fee per advert regardless of how often it is displayed;
- The replacement of the North Ayrshire Council Taxi roof sign with a smaller, locally produced, roof sign;
- Weatherproofing improvements to door signs;
- The provision of sufficient re-test slots during the Christmas period;
- Permission to allow vehicles with minor repair issues to continue to operate; and
- Amending the vehicle age limit cap from 5 to 8 years.

The meeting ended at 3.40 p.m.
