2	<p>"To replace the motion with the following:</p> <p>North Ayrshire Council acknowledges that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • there is concern about the increasing use of Nicotine Vaping Products (NVPs) by people under 18 years of age; • the use of single use Nicotine Vaping Products is having a detrimental environmental effect. <p>And</p> <p>The Council asks that Council Officers create a briefing or report for Members in order to properly explain and explore what mechanisms and powers council currently has to control the sale of illegal vaping products and the sale of vaping products to people under 18 years of age,</p> <p>And</p> <p>the Council agrees to write to both the Scottish and UK Governments to highlight the Council's concerns regarding these two issues and to urge them to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review legislation to ensure that there are effective means for enforcement officers to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Prevent the sale of NVPs to people under the age of 18; ◦ Control the sale of illegal NVPs within the UK and Scotland <p>And to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduce the attractiveness of NVPs as a life-style choice; • Ban the promotion of all NVPs to people under 18 years of age; • Establish effective recycling programmes for single use NVPs" 	<p>Cllr Billings (seconded by Cllr McLean)</p>
