- 12. How will the expenditure develop the group/organisation and benefit the local community?

The Trust has run this festival annually since 2004, and it includes workshops for adults and young people, in writing, theatre, music (in conjunction with the Royal Norther College of Music), film and visual arts, and develops community theatre productions as well as running a Summer School for talented young opera singers who work with 60 of local singers to create an excellent performance of an oratorio.

The Trust has published the Complete Works of Robert McLellan (a first in Scottish Literature) and runs an annual international poetry competition. The Trust has led Arran to be shortlisted for the Creative Places Award in 2013 and 2015.

All sectors of the Arran community benefit from its performances and workshops an in many different ways.

13. How does the application show innovation or development?

What the Trust hopes to achieve is that young people increasingly will benefit from expert professional tutors in music, writing and dance which will inspire, give confidence and enhance wellbeing and esteem.

Older members of the community, some complete beginners or newcomers to an art form, also benefit form working alongside professionals who inspire and arouse real interest which in turn creates a sense of wellbeing and purpose.

The event has the capacity to bring real enjoyment and a sense of achievement and wellbeing to all ages and the value that brings cannot be underestimated for the emotional and cultural health of the community.

It brings quality to the Island which local people find difficult to access due to geographical location. To attend first class concerts, drama and writing events on the mainland brings the necessity of overnight stays which is beyond the financial capacity of many of the residents.

The international annual poetry competition attracts poets form all over the world. This year the judge is acclaimed poet, Simon Armitage who will read and discuss his poems as part of the McLellan Arts Festival and run a workshop the following day for adults and young people. It is a rare and wonderful opportunity for young people and adult local writers to work with a poet of such standing and will enhance their skills considerably. In addition work begun at the workshop will undoubtedly lead to successful pieces which the young people will use as part of their writing portfolios in SQA exams.

In addition and importantly, the festival provides entertainment and a focus for visitors making the Island seem a more attractive tourist destination which, of course, is essential to the Island economy now, with the advent of RET even more important than ever.

14. Overall assessment?

It is without a doubt that this is a successful event that benefits the local community by encouraging local residents and schools to engage in this event. The McLellan Arts Festival is an important part of the cultural life of Arran.

Arran Theatre and Arts Trust has been recognised by Creative Scotland who have short listed Arran for the Creative Places Award both in 2014 and this year 2015.

This event attracts local people, visitors and tourists to Arran which has a good impact on the local economy.

The activities consist of 4 workshop sessions in 4 different art forms catering for a wide age range of young people in Arran High School.

- Poetry reading
- Writing Workshop
- Choral singing
- Dance workshop

The workshops will be run by students and their tutors, which will include those with support needs. It will greatly enhance the skills, engagement and enjoyment of participation in the arts of all those involved as well as developing the skills of those talented in singing.

Additionally there is a mixed instrumental workshop run by Chris Harrison, an experienced musician who runs workshops all over the UK. His workshop for young people will be available to all at Arran High School as well as some of the more vulnerable young people in the community not at school.

This will be an engaging and stimulating participatory experience giving confidence and a sense of well being to all as well as, it is hoped, the desire to participate in similar events and workshops in the future.

This is a unique opportunity for Arran young people who are interested in writing and developing their creative thinking skills and whose geographical situation gives little opportunity for such an experience. Many of the young people have been working with local amateur poets, under the aegis of Arran Theatre & Arts Trust, who have been running regular writing workshops after school. This new venture of working with the prestigous judge of the McLellan Poetry Award will greatly enhance their engagement in writing, skills and experience of the creative process and enhance the quality of their work (some of whom will be moving into Advanced Higher English) and thus, by pursuing excellence, their self esteem and confidence will improve.
