

Road Safety	Causalities on the roads continue to reduce whilst detection for drink driving are at a record high.







Ayrshire National Festive Drink/Driving Campaign 2018

The annual National Festive Drink/Drug Drive Campaign 2018, commenced on Saturday 1 December 2018 and concluded on Wednesday 2 January 2019. 
