
PRIORITY AREA	EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
Drug supply and misuse	Focus on Drug supply and misuse has been maintained and the positive results in the increased number of detections continues. Community engagement remains at the forefront of our intelligence gathering in order to target those people involved.
Violence, Disorder & ASB	Serious violent crime has reduced this year with fewer serious assaults and robberies. The total number of common assaults have increased which includes assaults on police officers and other emergency workers.
Dishonesty	This years increase in overall dishonesty crimes continues to be evident with issues around shoplifting and fraud accounting for most of the increase. Overall Housebreaking remains significantly down.
Road Safety	Road casualties have reduced considerably in comparison to last year. Local and National Campaigns will continue to be supported and partnership work to keep our roads safe is at the forefront. Concerns around identified speeding locations are being targeted.
Protecting people at risk of harm	As previously reported, our anticipated rise in the number of sexual crimes continues. Continued levels of increased confidence in reporting non-recent matters and indecent communications via online platforms are the contributing factors.










HATE CRIME - DATA OVERVIEW



The deployment of additional resources to continue the fight against drugs and serious and organised crime across Ayrshire has seen an increase in the number of detections for drug dealing and wider misuse.


Local community officers remain at the forefront of establishing links to the community in order to gather information about the dealers to allow action to be taken against them.

The increasing trend around sexual crime continues and is anticipated. The use of online platforms to communicate indecently continues and increased reporting of non recent crimes remains.


