

PRIORITY AREA	EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
Drug supply and misuse	Drug dealing and misuse has been a key focus in North Ayrshire again this year and with additional resources deployed across Ayrshire Division to tackle this issue we have seen a marked increase in both the number of offenders detected for supplying drugs and in possession.
Violence & ASB	Serious Violence has reduced this year and the continued reduction in and Antisocial Behaviour that has been experienced over recent years has again been maintained.
Dishonesty	Overall crimes of dishonesty saw a very small increase this year with rises in shoplifting and fraud accounting for this. The continued effort to decrease crimes of housebreaking has produced a further significant reduction this year.
Road Safety	The overall number of casualties on North Ayrshires Roads has seen a sizable reduction this year.



The increasing trend in the numbers of sexual crimes continues to be seen with non recent crimes recorded at their highest ever level.


Investigations continue to be undertaken in respect of former children's unit establishments which has resulted in numerous offences being recorded.










HATE CRIME - DATA OVERVIEW

Hate crime has remained at a similar level to last year although the trend of decreasing matters of a racial nature has continued whilst crimes motivated by religious prejudice has occurred.


